



Three Point Plan

The Three Point Plan is a reflection tool to assist school leaders to review their whole school approach to student ICT capability. The Reflect–Connect–Apply guiding questions in the accompanying table may inform the school’s approach.

The learning experiences required for students to be confident in online assessment, should be enacted through the delivery of the Australian Curriculum* and documented within the three levels of the whole school curriculum, assessment and reporting plan. Resources such as the [P-12 curriculum, assessment and reporting framework](#) and the [A whole-school approach to teaching reading](#) (DoE login required) provide valuable reflection questions to guide decisions.

School leaders might also review their existing school-improvement agendas and strengthen effective use of ICT into the plans. The [School improvement model](#) (DoE login required) provides a whole-school approach to school improvement. It sets out what we need to do to continue to improve, including roles and practices that teachers and leaders are expected to develop. The model comprises three parts:

1. Where we are (School Improvement Hierarchy)
2. How we learn (Inquiry Cycle), and
3. What impact we have (Standards of Evidence).

The School improvement model may be used to:

- structure conversations in your school about the next steps for school improvement
- develop a shared understanding and coherence of how to lift performance in your school
- develop a deep understanding of where your school is situated in the school improvement journey
- determine what to do next, when and how for your school’s improvement
- enhance differentiation in teaching so that every student’s learning needs are met
- monitor improvement
- provide feedback on improvement, innovation and change in schools, engaging and working with their school communities.

Use this model to plan your transition to online assessment, to ensure ICT use has a strong curriculum focus and is embedded within whole-school curriculum plans. Start with an analysis of where you are (analysis and discussion of data), using the School Improvement Hierarchy as a lens for determining where to begin.

The reflection questions following are designed to foster thinking around where you are and what evidence (data) would support planning.
